Earn college credit while learning to problem solve like an engineer! Johns Hopkins University's Engineering Innovation's program offers; "What is Engineering?" an introductory engineering course. This program is being offered this summer to current high school sophomores, juniors and seniors. Students who participate in the program have the opportunity to earn 3 transferable JHU college credits. The course is offered at both the Homewood and Montgomery campuses from June 30 - July 25.

Designed for rising high school juniors, seniors, and incoming college freshmen, this summer course enables students to study engineering concepts through lectures, hands-on lab experiments and team projects. This four week program is offered at sites in Maryland, Pennsylvania, California, and New Mexico. Students who successfully complete the course with an A or B receive three transferable college credits from Johns Hopkins.

Engineering Innovation uses a curriculum that demystifies technology, emphasizes engineering's innovative and creative aspects, and exposes students to engineering's diverse educational and career opportunities.

**It is not too late to apply!** Engineering Innovations still has space available in both the Homewood Campus and Montgomery County programs. There are plenty of full scholarships available to qualified students that cover the entire tuition for the 4 week program.
